
556 SMS ASSOCIATION SPRING 2007 NEWSLETTER

<u>DAN AND BARBARA GORNELL'S "GOOD DEEDS" WORK</u>
<u>IN BAKU, AZERBAIJAN</u>

Dan Gornell was a Deputy Missile Combat Crew Commander on Crew R-29 and I-35 (instructor crew) while in the 556th at Plattsburgh AFB. After retiring from the Air Force, as a meteorologist, he got into the banking and investment business in New Hampshire. After retiring again, this time to Colorado Springs, CO, he and his wife Barbara became involved with the Rotary International's children's dental project in Baku, Azerbaijan. Since 2001, Dan and Barbara have been logging hundreds of thousands of airline miles rotating to and from Baku every three months.

In a soon to be completed new medical facility, the dental clinic will share offices with an optical clinic there that has been operating for about five years. (The optical clinic is a humanitarian effort and the facility is funded by Medical Ministries International out of Texas). When completed, the dual dental/optical clinic will be the most modern medical facility in Azerbijan!

Two Azeri dentists are now in training to begin operating the dental clinic in February, prior to the grand opening in April, 2007. The Rotary provided dental equipment will be installed in the new facility in a few weeks. Another effort of the dental clinic is to invite volunteer US dentists to visit Baku and help train Azeri intern dentists on the modern equipment and advanced techniques. Upon residency graduation these former interns will have advanced training and begin to fill the need for more qualified dentists in the country. Dan is hopeful that the graduates will agree to volunteer a half day a week to his clinic treating the poor, in return for their training.

Recently, Dan was elected to the Board of Directors of the Caspian Compassion Project, the local Baku organization directing the optical clinic operation. This will allow him to continue oversight of the dental clinic as well as promote the optical clinic to a new group. The goals of the two organizations are the same, helping the poor people of Azerbijan with their medical care.

Future plans are to add a much needed gynecology clinic for the poor women of Baku. This effort was initiated by the president of the Baku International Rotary Club.

While Dan is busy on his Rotary projects, Barbara teaches English to university students and professionals at the International Learning Center in Baku. Plus she manages an English language program sponsored by the Baku International Women's Club in two local orphanages.

Dan and Barbara are to be thanked and congratulated for their tireless efforts on behalf of the people in Azerbijan. Thanks also to Rotary International for its sponsorship of these worthy projects.
